Registering on UCAS and drafting personal statements

Registering on UCAS and beginning process of applying. Personal statement drafing will begin.

Students allocate their UCAS referee to help and guide them to create 2 drafts of their personal statements before the summer break.

Students research HE courses in the Unifrog Subjects library, idenitfying wider reading and skills required for their courses of interest. Students will then use the Activities and Competencies tools to evidence these.

Finding the right Apprenticeship

Students learn about different apprenticeship levels, research apprenticeship opportunities, and start logging key competencies required by employers.

Students discover MOOCs (Massive Open Online Courses)

Students learn more about MOOCs, what they can study, and why it's beneficial to do so. They then research three MOOCs to study over the summer break.
