On Thursday March 23, 2023, at 5:30 p.m., the pupils and staff of Townley's Economics Department will be hosting an inaugural event – **Townley Economic Forum**.

The aim is to showcase the work that pupils have done throughout the course of this academic year thus far. The event will take the form of a debate, where pupils will engage in discourse guided by the moot 'Using the price mechanism to internalise the social costs associated with pollution is the most effective and efficient way to address such market failure.

We hope to demonstrate the extent to which our pupils have grown in their knowledge and understanding of the content. Consequently, the event, mostly student-led, will feature students debating; forming the judging panel; posing questions; and providing feedback to their colleagues. This is a perfect opportunity for the members of the Townley community to develop a better understanding of the A-level Economics course we offer as a department.
