The event is for young people in year 11 and those aged 16-24 who want to start an apprenticeship from September, and those aged 16-24 who are not in education, employment, or training and looking for help to find a course or a job.

- Session 2: 7.00pm to 8.30pm

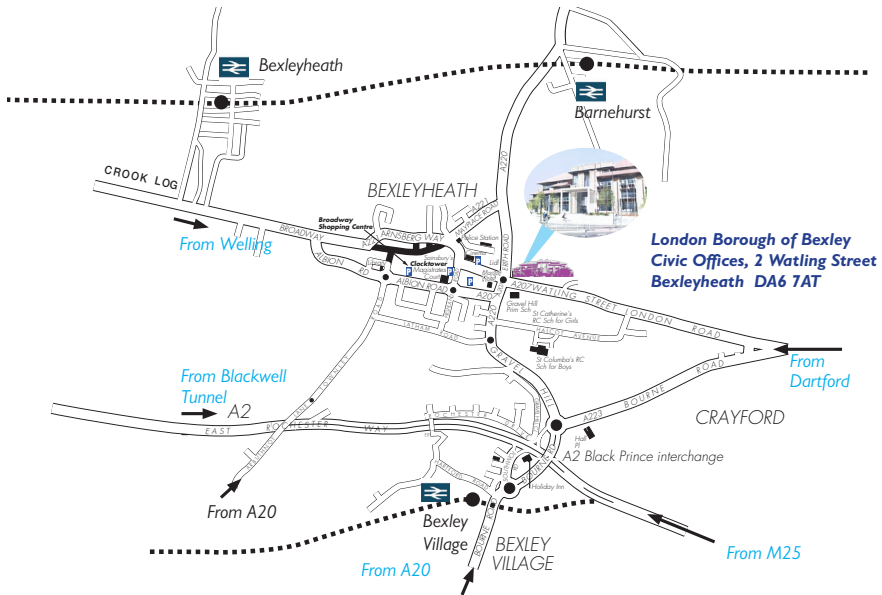

Getting here

Coming by car? The nearest car parks are the Albion Road public car park and the Cinema public car park - both just a short walk from the Civic Offices.

Coming by bus? The following routes stop at the Bexleyheath Clock Tower, a 5-10 minute walk from the Civic Offices: 89, 96, 132, 229, 269, 401, 422, 469, 486, 492, B11, B13, B14, B15 and B16.

Coming by train? The closest station is Barnehurst, a 15-20 minute walk from the Civic Offices.

Who will I get to meet?

We've invited local further education colleges and independent training providers who deliver apprenticeship training. We've also invited employers with apprenticeship opportunities starting later this year.

As in previous years, we've invited organisations that provide careers and education information, advice, and guidance and organisations who provide support to 16-24 year olds who are not in education, employment or training.
